## LESSON 01 - WHAT IS PROJECT?

So first of all, what is a project? So a project is a set of activities determined to reach a specific goal and it has three main constraints time constraint, cost constraint and scope constraint. It is a very important characteristic to make sure that we have a return on that investment. And if we are going to invest X amount of dollars, then we're going to have a return in that amount of dollars invested. And this return on investment talks about the results that we are seeking. When you are going to manage a project and you are going to use the project management methodology and tools, it is very important to get to know what are the results that you are trying to achieve. Once we determine the time, cost and resource constraint, it is very important to determine who is going to be with us implementing this project, to select what do we want to achieve and immediately who are we going to work with to make sure that we reach these goals. Once we determine those necessary resources, we need to start distributing the tasks and the responsibilities. We need to make sure that we have a calendar in which of each participant and each resource is clear, what activities they have, what do they need to achieve in a certain time, and in achieving those activities, then we're going to

meet our final result. Finally, we need to make sure that in the project management methodology we apply the enough knowledge, the enough skills, the enough tools and the required techniques to develop these project activities and then make sure that we are taking advantage of our resources. We are with the correct people to execute the tasks in a specific timeline and then we are going to be reaching the specific objectives and purpose of the project.

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
